

First Hawaiian Employees and Retirees Give a Gift of \$637,781 to 31 Charities

More than \$4.7 million raised for charity since 2007

(Honolulu, Hawaii, December 17, 2014) – First Hawaiian Bank employees and retirees made a record gift of \$637,781 to 31 charities as part of the bank's annual Kokua Mai employee giving campaign. This was the most amount ever raised through Kokua Mai. Since Kokua Mai's inception in 2007, bank employees and retirees have donated more than \$4.7 million to support charities in Hawaii, Guam and the CNMI, according to an announcement today by Bob Harrison, First Hawaiian Bank chairman, president and chief executive officer.

"Contributions to Kokua Mai are completely voluntary; to have 98 percent of our employees participate in this effort is tremendous and says a lot of about the generosity and caring our employees have for their community," Harrison said. "In addition to monetary donations, our employees are also out in the community volunteering their time and talents to help various non-profits throughout the year."

For the second year in a row, 98 percent of First Hawaiian Bank employees made monetary contributions to assist Kokua Mai charities. The bank, its Foundation and employees annually donate more than \$3.0 million to over 400 charities making it one of the largest corporate contributors to charity in Hawaii, Guam and the CNMI.

First Hawaiian Bank established its Kokua Mai giving program to ensure 100 percent of employee donations go directly to local charities. The online giving program is completely run by employees. This year's Kokua Mai campaign ran from October 15 through November 14 with employees conducting department fundraisers throughout.

Each year the bank's branches serve as collection points for various charitable causes including the Star-Advertiser Good Neighbor Fund, Special Olympics, and the Aloha for Puna Fund to support recovery and relief efforts on the Big Island.
